

## British Columbia Court of Appeal Practice Directive (Civil & Criminal) Title: Declarations in Court Orders

## Issued: 5 March 2020

When Court of Appeal pronounces a judgment issuing a declaration, whether it is a judgment upholding a declaration made by the court below, a judgment setting aside a declaration made by the court below, or a judgment overturning the decision below and declaring a provision unconstitutional, the party drafting the Court of Appeal's order must include the declaration. The declaration may be styled in a form analogous to the examples below.
